

Moderator Overview 2024

We started the year concerned about the future of our little church. Our membership was down, giving was down, due to the loss of several members, and costs were going up. Our projected budget was \$40,000 more than our projected pledges We were concerned about how long we could keep our doors open. We were worried how would we still do all the wonderful things we were called to do. We had to start drawing on our Sass Bequest Funds to make ends meet. BUT we had faith in God, faith in our people and HOPE that we could survive and continue to be the "Little Church With The Big Heart". Well things did get better, Our finances are stable and we ended the year with a healthy checkbook balance. Our giving increased, We didn't need as much of the monthly drawn from Sass money, so we redirected it into 2 CD's that are getting a good interest rate. We have welcomed some awesome new people into our family. And we had a great year filled with fellowship, sharing and caring. We still need to be concerned about the future and what it will hold for us, but we can never lose our faith and hope.

Here's the highlights from 2024. Everyone should be proud of the great things we are doing here.

- ---We had a steady attendance averaging 25 a Sunday in person and an average of 7 watching online
- ---Souper Bowl of Caring smashed the goal of 150 cans of soup by collecting 176 cans that was used in our Blessing Pantry
- --Tania & Kevin Messmer ran our 1st Super Bowl Squares that raised \$3575 for our Blessing Pantry.
- --- "Stitch in Time" ministry Blessed 49 Blankets and 15 Kid Activity Kits for cancer patients. And through it's raffle and bake sale raised \$305 for the Nick Foundation.
- --- Easter Egg Scramble with Ridge Methodist church complete with the Easter Bunny and 15 kids scrambling for candy
- --- Easter Breakfast
- --- Yoga classes in the Labrynith
- -- Garedn Produced 497 pounds of food that was donated to Community Services of Northwester Indiana
- ---Served 7 Homeless Lunches at the Hammond Homeless Shelter
- --- Church Picnic with Ridge Methodist
- --- Animal & Backpack Blessings
- ---Spooky Faith Sunday including Chili Cook-off & Pumkin Contest with Tim Brown being crowned The Chili Champ
- --- All Saints Day
- --- Veteran's Day Celebration honoring our veterans for their service
- --- Senior Food Box program every month not matter the weather
- --Provided 10 "Angels" from Highland schools with gifts and food cards to 10 families for Christmas.
- --- Wonderful Christmas Season Blue Christmas & Christmas Eve Services with special music by Delia & Leah Helpingstine and Cheryl Sorrell.






Thank You!!

When we put out a call for help, you are always there to help. This year we were able to provide 86 Health Kits to Sojourner's Truth House, a place that serves abused women and children and the Hammond Homeless Shelter. We also collected for Sojourner's boxes of women and children clothing that they really need. Most times they arrive at Sojourners with just the clothes on their backs. During the "Souper Bowl of Caring" we put out the call for 150 cans of soup, and again you kicked it through the goal post with 176 cans!! We also helped the Highland Schools with their Angel Tree. As your pastor, this has been a beautiful thing to witness. It truly is a privilege to serve alongside you.

In this past year, Stitch of Time has grown and expanded to include hospital kits for children going through chemotherapy and partners with NICK (Northwest Indiana Cancer Kids). The Senior Food Box program continues to be a strong and vital presence for the clients who are under our care. The Farm has produced good, nourishing produce for those who do not have regular access to healthy vegetables. Thanks to the Football Squares fundraiser led by Kevin and Tania, the Blessing Box has maintained its vital roll of giving to our neighbors no-questions-asked.

Our Labyrinth ministry continues to connect with people in our community. Yoga at the Labyrinth was a new initiative that started last summer with plans to continue this year! I am also signed up for Advanced Labyrinth Facilitator Training with Veriditas with hopes of learning new ways to connect our labyrinth to the community. Lights were donated to the labyrinth so that people can walk it anytime of day or evening.

We continue to make new friends while also saying goodbye to others we have known for a long time. Our children teach us new lessons and we gain wisdom from those with years of experience. Our partnership with Ridge is ever-evolving, and yet we stand on our gifts to share the "Celebrate and Share Christ's Love through feeding the Body, Mind, and Spirit". This year, I do not come to this meeting with a sense of fear for our church but conviction in the important work God has for us to do in these tenuous times. We are and will continue to be a vital light for our neighbors to receive. We are called to BE Good News!

While I continue with my MA in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, I believe we are building that "field of dreams" where others can and will find healing, strength, and friendship with our little church with the great big heart. We are called to do good work, my friends. I write this in awe of what God's Spirit is leading us toward together.
