A Word from Our Board Chair

Hello friends,

At the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 28, 2024, we discussed the present difficulties our Church is facing. We have reached a time in the life of our beloved community of faith where our attendance and finances are falling to low levels, mostly due to the deaths of so many of our members. Our budget for 2024 is \$125,000 while our pledges are \$55,000 and the rent we collect from Sober School and Tops doesn't cover the difference. We have had to start taking monthly withdrawals from the Sass Bequest to help with our bills. While that fund is \$233,000, it won't last forever. The Board is concerned for our future and we have started a conversation on how we want to move forward. We are looking at ways to address it in order to help keep us moving forward. **Our next Board Meeting is Tuesday, April 16th at 7 P.M., and I can't stress enough how important it is for all department heads, trustees, elders and deacons to attend.** The Board meetings are open to the congregation, so anyone can attend. Going forward there will be difficult questions to address, but I have faith that we will work through them together for the good of our church. We are doing so many great things! We are doing what we as Disciples are called to do. Let us all be hopeful, prayerful, and strong as we seek guidance and direction on our faith journey together.


